

A CENTURY OF GOODWILL



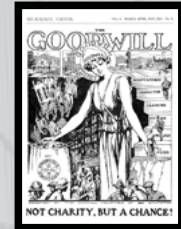
1902

In Boston Edgar J. Helms initiates what will become Goodwill Industries in Boston.



1921

The slogan — Not Charity, But a Chance — is used to publicize Goodwill's efforts to give people hope and independence through work.



1915

Goodwill Industries of Brooklyn was founded by Dr. Henry Park Schauffler.

1945

Goodwill becomes known for helping people with disabilities through job training.



1990

The following programs were launched: Bronx Job Club, Customer Service Training, Harlem Supported Employment and Project High Road.

1960

Boston designer Joseph Selame creates the universally recognized Goodwill logo.

1970

Goodwill moves into its new 15-story residential and rehabilitation service tower in Astoria, Queens.

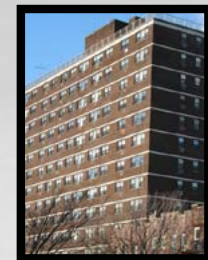
1996

GoodTemps was established in 1996 to meet the booming demand for temporary staff. GoodTemps quickly became the largest supplier of temps to New York City.



1980

Mobile Rehabilitation Service was launched.



1999

Goodwill Greater New York joins their neighbors across the Hudson River to become Goodwill Industries of Greater New York and Northern New Jersey.

First Goodwill 360-Degree on Jobs Forum was held in New York City with DOLETA Assistant Secretary Jane Oates as Keynote Speaker.



2014
