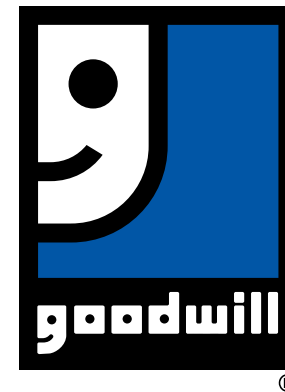

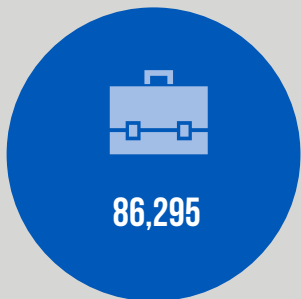

WORK IS OUR CORE

As a founding member of Goodwill Industries International's community-based network of 165 non-profits, Goodwill Industries of Greater New York and Northern New Jersey, Inc. has helped individuals and their families achieve a better life for 100 years through programs and services that today serve thousands of people annually.

We provide workforce development services, youth and community development programs, and retail and business opportunities throughout the five boroughs of New York City, Long Island, the Hudson Valley, and Northern New Jersey.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

- Work readiness and employment preparation for individuals with disabilities, veterans, refugees and immigrants, young adults, unemployed and under-employed
- Job placement and retention services
- Contextualized literacy, credentialed skills training, financial literacy, education and counseling
- Child support adjustment assistance and reunification with children for non-custodial parents
- Wrap around support including counseling, housing, legal and medical assistance, transportation, clothing, and childcare
- Work with employers to develop industry standards

BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES

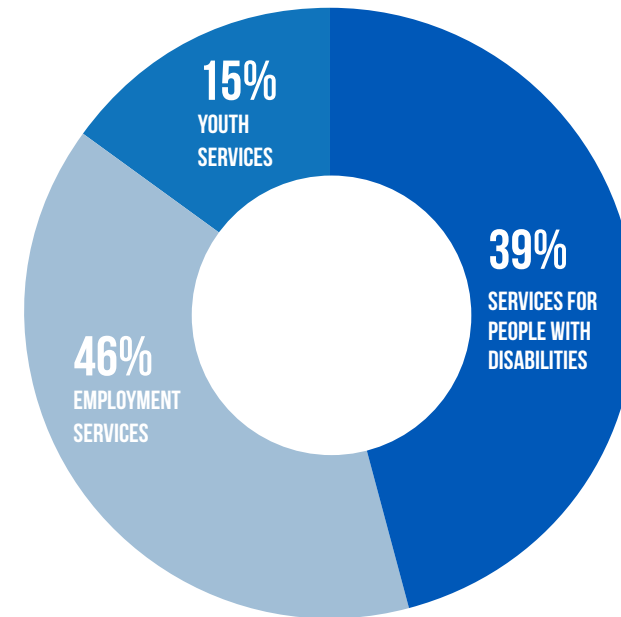
- Person-centered recovery and rehabilitation services including vocational assessments and placement which promote self sufficiency
- Accredited Clubhouses support members in developing social relationships and employment
- Supported housing for formerly homeless individuals with psychiatric disabilities
- Peer specialists provide recovery oriented services in employment, housing, benefits and advocacy

REHABILITATION SERVICES

- Customized services to individuals with intellectual and sensory disabilities including vocational assessments to determine interests,

- Day services provide opportunities for individuals to explore their community and interests
- Job placement, community internships and job coaching

BUSINESS OPERATIONS

- Retail stores produce revenue to support communities and mission services
- Provide training and employment opportunities for individuals with disabilities and other barriers to employment
- Contract with private businesses and

government to provide commercial services that build revenue and create jobs

- GoodTemps, our temporary staffing agency, sends 800 people, mostly persons with disabilities, to work each week
- Create partnerships which foster environmentally responsible practices and reduce landfill waste

YOUTH & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

- Provide enriching STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, Math) focused activities in school and community based environments. Other services include ESL classes, library/literacy activities, computer lab,

mentoring, homework help, tutoring, art and cultural activities, summer camp, and sports

- Facilitate the transition from secondary school to college and/or the workforce by providing career and college exploration programming
- Mentoring and support services to children at high risk and their families
- Strengthen families and communities through enriched after school, evening and weekend services

- Outreach and tutoring services for children and families living in shelters
- State of the art family learning center for children and adults
